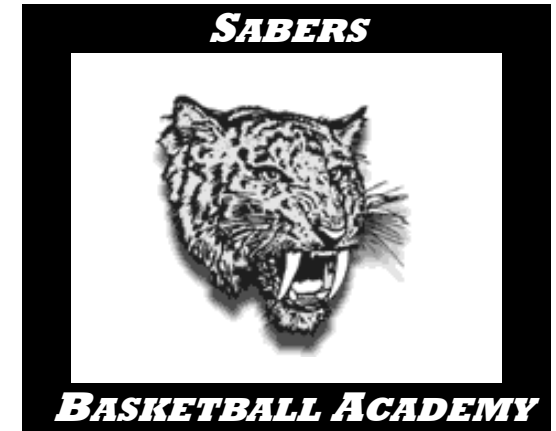

"Focus on the Fundamentals Day Camp" (4 Great Sessions) (Grades 2-12)
Session 1: July 6-10

Through intense hands on instruction campers will have an opportunity to focus on the fundamentals of the game. Campers will focus on ball-handling, passing, footwork, shooting, defense and team play. Daily drills and contest will help improve and reinforce the fundamentals taught throughout the week. Each camper will receive a camp t-shirt, water bottle, and a personalized report card.

"Individual Skill Development Clinic" (Grades 2-12)
July 17-18
 Fri., 5pm-8pm / Sat., 9am-12noon

This clinic focuses on overall individual skill development. Learn drills that will help take your game to the next level. Areas covered include breaking down the defense off the dribble, playing off screens, and being an efficient playmaker. Each camper will also receive an individual skill development workout packet.

"Ball Handling & Passing Clinic" (Grades 2-12)
July 24-25
 Fri., 5pm-8pm / Sat., 9am-12noon

This is an intense clinic that will focus on dribbling and passing. Learn drills that will help you build confidence in your ball handling abilities. Areas of focus will be ball control, seeing the floor, and fighting pressure. Each camper will also receive a ball handling skill development workout packet.
